*“The Mind of the Terrorist “
Presentation by Jerrold M. Post, M.D.*

Neighbor and acclaimed researcher and author Jerry Post shared his insights at the BCA Quarterly meeting on June 2. His book "The Mind of the Terrorist" provides an illuminating look into the mind of the leaders of several terrorist organizations, including al-Qaeda, the Shining Path, and The Red Brigades. Although the organizations differ, there are some common themes, and he provides a valuable exposition of al-Qaeda, its leadership and its structure. He concludes with a strategy for waging a war on terror. Dr. Post is Professor of Psychiatry, Political Psychology, and International Affairs at George Washington University. His most recent presentation at an International Conference in July concluded: “We are in an era of digital warfare, with both sides struggling to achieve dominance. For many years, the West, relying on military superiority, insufficiently attended to the power of information in waging asymmetric conflict. Mapping the information battlefield is crucial to winning the war for hearts and minds. “

In Memoriam: Maria Benzinger, M.D.

One of our oldest BCA seniors, Dr. Maria Benzinger, died April 2, 2011 at age 93. She was one of the first BCA Seniors to contact us. She helped our committee by describing her problems with Aging-in-place and by telling us how we could help her and other seniors. She volunteered to hold a tea and a luncheon in her home for other BCA seniors and was a gracious hostess. Although Maria was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in January, she was able to stay in her home until her death in April. Her family, Hospice, friends and BCA volunteers helped her. Maria lived at 6607 Broxburn Drive for 47 years. Her husband, Dr. Theodor H. Benzinger, died in 1999. Two children and 4 grand children survive her. Maria trained as a surgeon in Germany and practiced in Berlin through World War II. She moved to the United States in 1950, trained as an anesthesiologist, and served as Chief Medical Officer at DC General from 1961 until her retirement in 1987. She was active in volunteer work. Information for BCA Seniors by Edith Miles

The BCA Good Neighbors Committee is working to help BCA seniors who want to continue living in their homes as they age (Age-in-Place). Most BCA seniors have told us that they plan to stay in their homes as long as they can. The committee sends information about services for seniors and BCA events to about 60 BCA seniors by e-mail. Committee members visit seniors to learn what help they need from volunteers and whether they would enjoy social events or interest groups. Social Activities. The committee sponsored a senior table at the Fall Festival and at the Spring Fling. We also held a Tea at the Marein-Efron house March 2 and a business meeting at the Miles house March 30. The committee plans to sponsor more social events or interest groups for BCA seniors. We sponsored a C & O canal hike May 28. We plan to have a potluck lunch at a home and lunch at a restaurant. Transportation. The committee has a list of BCA members who have volunteered to transport seniors to appointments with doctors. BCA seniors who need transportation can ask us to find a BCA volunteer or to recommend a reliable taxi driver. Another possibility is to use the Senior Connection (301-962-0820; www.seniorconnectionmc.org). This nonprofit organization provides transportation for seniors.

Resources. The committee has prepared a directory of Resources for Seniors. We plan to increase the number of recommended services listed (e. g. a handy man, driver, or person to remove snow) and welcome your suggestions.
